



The Fort Loudoun Lake Association is proud to report the total number of trash bags, logs and miscellaneous trash items that we have picked up from Fort Loudoun Lake and its watershed for each month, beginning in January of 2007.

We have Zone Managers out on the Lake on a daily basis picking up trash from the shoreline and from our boom skimmers and our milk jug skimmers, which are positioned along creeks and tributaries that outfall into Fort Loudoun Lake. Our Zone Managers also remove dangerous logs and debris that pose a threat to boaters on Fort Loudoun Lake. Miscellaneous trash may include runaway boat docks, large trash pieces such as patio furniture, old tires, coolers, buckets, traffic cones, and more.
